They like the public buildings, including the Town Hall and the downtown churches and the library. They like the fact that the stores are locally owned and not national franchises. They like the Common, and the way it is a vibrant center of community activity.

In essence, Gorham is open to change, to having more business development and economic opportunity, but it is cautious that those things not disrupt the things that are already working well in the community. It is seeking a balance of those elements as it moves forward.
