Department Update 01/12/2022

Fire and EMS

Department members have been busy responding to our normal variety and frequency of calls. With the winter season upon us we expect to see an uptick in motor vehicle accidents during inclement weather, when and if, snow arrives. We take this time to remind residents and property owners the importance of maintaining the heating devices in your home to provide safe and reliable service during the winter months.

With the cold weather and closed window season here to stay for a few more months, it is also a good time to replace the batteries in your smoke and carbon monoxide detectors to ensure they are ready to protect your family if needed. As a reminder, detectors should be checked for proper operation every 6 months, have their batteries replaced yearly if they are serviceable, and replaced during the 8–10-year time span. If you encounter smoke detector or carbon monoxide detector activation with no explanation you can call the Fire Department for assistance or GPD Dispatch after hours for assistance.

As we start a new year, we look back the year 2021 and find the following statistics regarding call response:

Fire Department: 251 calls for service including fires, accidents, rescues, service calls and inspections.

EMS: The ambulance continued to see an in crease in calls with a final tally of 806 with following breakdown:

Current response is covered by on call members and daytime staffing who respond from home to the station. We ask for your support at Town Meeting as we move forward with this staffing plan.
