

Change of Address Requirements

- RSA 261:45 and RSA 263:35-A person moving to NH from out-of-state has 60 days to change his/her address with the State and obtain a NH Driver License
- RSA 263:9-A person moving from one town to another within NH has 30 days to change his/her address by filling out the Record Change Request
- RSA 261:55-A name change must be done within 10 days

Early Renewals

- May be done up to 4 months early including the month of expirations (RSA 261:62)

Example: A renewal due in July can register as early as April

- They will not pay more and they can get it inspected early!
- Inspections can be done up to 4 months early and for a period of 16 months.

What's the deal with inspections?

- RSA 266:1
 - For a new registration, including a transfer, a vehicle needs to be inspected within 10 days of registration.
 - 266:1, IV *“All other expired motor vehicle inspections shall be subject to the 10-day grace periods in RSA 266:5”*
 - **This means a person has 10 days into the following month on a renewal that is completed on time.**
 - If a renewal is late they have no grace period and they should be issued a 48-hour permit to get the vehicle to the inspection station.

New Registrations/New Purchase

- What does a customer need?
 - A certificate of origin – issued from the manufacturer when a vehicle is brand new and has never been titled.
 - Title – if they purchased the vehicle from an individual or bought it outright from a dealer.
 - CTA – purchased from a NH Dealer, or an out of state dealer with title application privileges, or private sale with financing from an in-state lienholder
 - If vehicle is exempt from title (1999 and older) they will need proof of VIN #
 - Verification of VIN form (aka TDMV 19A) or
 - Photocopy of a title, or
 - Copy of the current or expired **NH** registration, and
 - Bill of Sale meeting all of the requirements of RSA 261:148
